REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

Every volunteer is required to have completed the <u>Child Protection Policy Training Video & Quiz</u> (if reading a print out version, go to <u>vcob.org/vbs-volunteers</u> to access all links) before they serve. This is done on a yearly basis per our insurance policy.

BACKGROUND CHECK

All volunteers ages 18+ must undergo a background check. Our staff will reach out directly if this applies to you.

DEPARTMENT OF CHILD & FAMILY SERVICES

All volunteers ages 18+ who serve in Village Kids or Awana are required to complete the <u>State of IL DCFS</u> <u>Mandatory Reporter Training</u>. Our staff will reach out directly if this applies to you.

PREPARING FOR VBS

- **T-Shirt**: Please wear your t-shirt every day OR....
- **Costuming**: Find creative ways to dress like a Pacific Northwesterner!
- **Water bottle**: Come with a full water bottle every day. There will be water stations arranged throughout our scheduled activities. Water bottles will also be provided as needed.
- **Sunscreen**: Be sure to pack some sunscreen and/or apply it beforehand.
- No cell phone use: Please be conscientious of how often you use your cell phone while
 volunteering at Breaker Rock Beach. VBS is a time to focus on creating interpersonal
 connections without the distraction of technology. These kids covet and deserve your full
 attention!
- **Read**: To be prepared, make sure to read all the materials shared with you, including small group materials, prior to VBS.

LINGO TO KNOW

- Huddles: This year, groups will be known as huddles. Each huddle is named after an animal native to the Pacific Northwest (e.g., orca whales, thresher sharks, red-tailed hawks, etc.).
- Lifeguards: Huddles will be grouped together in four separate teams. Lifeguards are the individuals who oversee each of the teams. They will serve as support to the huddle guides within their teams.
- Boardwalk: Outdoor activity rotations area (previously known as the Village Square and Marketplace)
- Shipwreck: Outdoor games area
- Bonfire Missions: Missions area (Classroom 1)
- Sandcastle Cove: Bible teaching area
- Seaside Snack Shack: Snack booth
- Fireside Chats: Huddle meeting areas (designated spaces by the trees or in the sanctuary, labeled with signs identifying the different huddle names)
- Breaker Rock: Meeting place for assemblies (sanctuary for elementary & 5/6 and gym for preschool & mini-campers)

PARKING + FLOW OF TRAFFIC

Upon arrival, please enter only from W. Bartlett Rd. We have designated areas of the parking lot for volunteers and drop-off parking. Please refer to the map below to identify where to park. Exit only to Devon Ave.



ARRIVAL

Please plan on arriving by 8:20 at the latest every day. On Monday morning, we will set up our outdoor portions of Breaker Rock Beach for the first time and could use a lot of help! If you are able, please arrive by 7:30 a.m. on Monday morning. We will have a time for announcements and group prayer for all volunteers every morning in the sanctuary at 8:25. The expectation is that all volunteers attend this brief meeting every day unless personally told otherwise by Erica or Breanne.

DROP-OFF + PICK-UP

Drop-off begins at 8:45, and pick-up runs from 12:00 - 12:15. Parents/guardians have been asked to escort their student(s) to their drop-off area, identify their group (this year called *huddle*), and collect their student's laminated pick-up card from the huddle guide. They will use this card to pick up their student(s) at the end of the day. To ensure the safety of all children, students will not be allowed to leave their huddle guide unless the individual picking him/her up has the appropriate pick-up card. If there are any issues with this, please touch base with Erica. <u>5/6 students will not have pick-up cards.</u>

Drop-off and pick-up will be in the following locations:

- K-4th: Sanctuary
- Preschool: Gym
- Mini-Camp: Gym (2/3s classroom)
- 5/6: Check-in with huddle guide in the foyer near the couches (no pick-up cards)

VOLUNTEER BREAKS, SNACKS, + BEVERAGES

Volunteer breaks for elementary and 5/6 huddle guides are scheduled during their huddle's time at the Boardwalk. One guide from each huddle will take their break during the first 15 minutes, and the second guide from each huddle will take their break during the last 15 minutes. Elementary and 5/6 lifeguards will take their breaks during Bible teaching time. Preschool huddle guides will take their breaks during their huddle's music rotation time. All huddle guides must check in with their lifeguard before going on their break. Breaks can be taken in the 601. Snacks and drinks will be available all day in the 601. Coffee will be available for volunteers at the coffee bar.

 There will be dinner for all and waterplay for kids. Kona Ice will be available for purchase.
